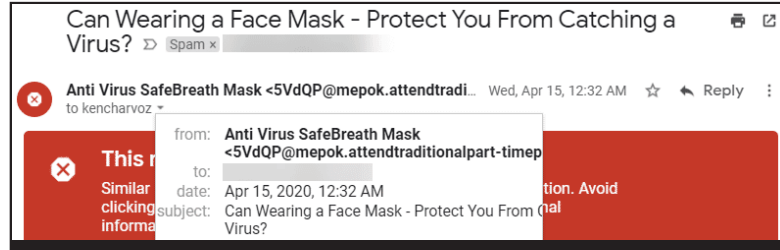

MAKE TIME IN 2022 TO PROTECT YOURSELF ON THE INTERNET

1. Trust your lived experience—if a phone call, email or offer feels ‘fishy’, is urgent, makes you feel scared or sounds too good to be true, take your time to respond
2. Make time to create strong passwords if you haven't already
3. Make time to examine the email address of the sender of every email

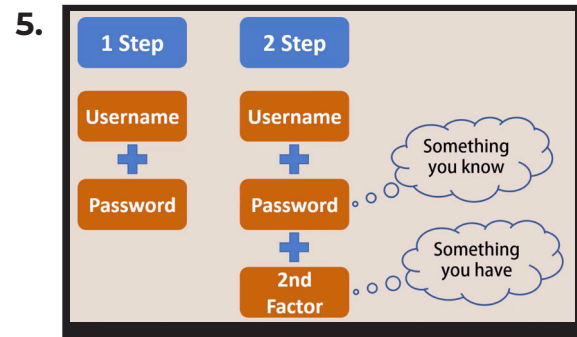

4. Make time to examine and preview web addresses and links before you click or tap—cybercriminals use extra periods, capital l's and lower case l's to make web addresses look legitimate
